Bible & Literacy

<input type="checkbox"/> Read the Bible Reader story "A Very Wise Man" on page 115. Have your child write the title, label the page number, and draw an illustration. Then have them write a one sentence summary about the story. <input type="checkbox"/> Complete the lowercase p and r word sheet in your child's folder.	<input type="checkbox"/> Have your child write two sentences on a piece of paper - one that is a fact and one that is an opinion. Make sure they have a capital letter, finger spaces, and a period!
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Phonics & Reading

<input type="checkbox"/> Have your child look through "Phil and Steph" and color/highlight/underline any words they see with a "ph". Then have them practice reading the story. <input type="checkbox"/> Have your child read through the AAR fluency sheet pg. 245	<input type="checkbox"/> Complete the digraph sort by having your child sort the pictures based on if they hear the "ph" or "wh" sound. <input type="checkbox"/> Read with your child for 20 minutes. While reading, have them look for some of their HFW they've learned: two, see, out, from.
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Math

<input type="checkbox"/> Complete Chapter 9 Exercise 1	<input type="checkbox"/> Have your child find a set of objects around the house (shapes, stuffed animals, crayons, etc). Give them clues on how to lay them out using ordinal numbers (for example: "Place the blue crayon first. The green crayon should be the third from the bottom. The yellow crayon should be second."). After they're done, have them practice saying the ordinal numbers for each object, "first, second, third, fourth", etc).
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Unit Study: Science (Optional)

<input type="checkbox"/> Students can continue working on their optional forest biome dioramas. The presentation date for the forest biomes will be <u>Thursday, January 8th</u> . If your child would like to create something different than the traditional shoebox diorama this time, they are welcome to create a poster or even a travel brochure highlighting what can be found in the forest biome!

While reading, have them look for some of their HFW they've learned: about, her, made, for.
